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Who are we?

The Perryfields Outreach Team:

- is based at Perryfields Primary Pupil Referral Unit .
- is based on expertise built up over the last 20 years.
- supports Key Stage 1 and 2 pupils in mainstream maintained and academy schools in Worcester, Malvern, Pershore , Martley, Evesham, and Droitwich Pyramids.
- Consists of experienced outreach and PRU staff , working flexibly according to pupils and schools' needs.
- are licensed Thrive practitioners.

What do we do?

The Perryfields Outreach Team:

- works within the SEN code of practice framework , in partnership with schools, to offer advice and support on issues relating to behaviour management and inclusion.
- works with schools to assist with the interventions for pupils as part of the Graduated Response, liaising with the Headteacher, senior staff and other staff about issues relating to pupils' wellbeing and behaviour including early intervention and assessment.
- helps schools to maintain equal opportunities and improve learning outcomes for pupils with behavioural, emotional and social difficulties.
- works with mainstream school staff to support the development of whole school policies and practices.
- works directly with pupils who are referred to the service, carefully monitoring, reviewing and evaluating intervention to ensure that this continues to meet their needs.
- works closely both with PRU staff and mainstream school staff in the planning and preparation for individual pupils attending Perryfields Intervention Programmes (PIPs).
- contributes to the provision of a 'seamless service' during a pupil's placement at PRU, through active involvement and communication with the school, the pupil, parents and PRU staff.
- works proactively to provide targeted support and assist with the successful reintegration of pupils into their mainstream schools.
- works proactively with professionals, the Local Authority and outside agencies (including the voluntary sector) to ensure that the service provided is cohesive and effective.

How do we do this?

- We agree intervention with schools on referral.
- We monitor and evaluate the impact of the intervention.
- We can give advice and suggest strategies following a classroom observation.
- We work with mainstream staff, providing support, advice and training.
- We can assist with whole school approaches e.g. audits, policies.
- We can help with recommending or providing resources.
- We can work with individual pupils, small groups and whole classes.
- We provide 6-week Intervention programmes at the PRU (PIPs) to enable pupils to get themselves back on track.
- We work with other agencies and professionals as part of a team around the child.
